



## To move from Provisional to Full Registration

Provisional Registration –  
Working towards a Recognised qualification and/or Enough Practical Experience

### **Working towards a Recognised qualification**

‘The above person is provisionally registered until such time as they *complete a Recognised social work qualification* at which time they will be fully registered’

The criteria set by the Social Workers Registration Board (SWRB) when you applied for provisional registration was that

- You have enrolled or intend to enrol and begin studying in 2005 for a Qualification on the SWRB Schedule of Recognised New Zealand Qualifications
- Apply between 1 January 2005 and 31 December 2005 and be enrolled or intend to enrol and begin studying in 2005 for a SWRB Recognised New Zealand Qualification. This will enable you to be registered under section 14 of the Social Workers Registration Act 2003. This refers to provisional registration, which is renewable, at the discretion of the Board, every two years for up to a total of no more than eight years. The qualification must be completed within that total time.

**Upon providing a certified copy of a recognised social work qualification, your application for ‘Full’ registration will be presented to the board for approval.**

### **Working towards Enough Practical Experience**

‘The above person is provisionally registered until such time as they *complete 2000 hours supervised practice* at which time they will be fully registered’

**Upon providing written confirmation from your employer or supervisor that you have met the criteria of 2000 hours of supervised practice, your application for ‘Full’ registration will be presented to the board for approval.**
